1) ATTENDANCE / APOLOGIES

2) MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

Minutes of 20/05/2026 meeting were agreed and signed.

3) MATTERS ARISING

Nothing not covered in the agenda.

4) TREASURER'S REPORT

Balances are £9311.16 (£265.89 interest for the year) in the Charity Bank notice account and £3061.13 in the Community account. £20 in cash. Membership steady at 232.

5) WEBSITE UPDATE – fasthosts (new host supplier) today said they cannot migrate as our version of php too old. AF says we cannot update php to v7.4. AF to report at next meeting.

6) VGP

- a) Band confirmed - £750. 7-piece band! They require payment in cash. (First aider also wants £150 cash). Mike will provide the cash and claim back.
- b) Village Hall booked
- c) Mark Boden back to do electrics this year.
- d) Meat order:
 - (a) AF spoken with AB (Tom Hixson, now). They can supply meat (58Kg large top bit or top & rump), 100 burgers & 175 pork sausages but will **not** put the meat on the spit.
 - (b) Rupert spoken with Castle Meats. They say they can supply a 58Kg top bit **and** put on the spit. Delivery to Taplow Court and burgers & saus currently unknown. No track record with Castle Meats.
 - (c) Executive decision to go with AB. VGP minutes will document to check out alternatives for next year.
 - (d) Cliff at Taplow Court (TC) agreed meat can be received at TC and store overnight in their fridge

- (e) AF confirmed all meat with AB (Phone: 01628 825137) on 12/6/26 and given Cliff as contact to receive meat. (Note: AB phonelines shut down at midday).
- (f) Logs agreed with TC and delivery thereof on Friday afternoon (Cliff again)
- (g) Cliff will deliver BBQs to Village Green around 10:30 on Saturday.
- (h) Cliff has briefed TC security to permit access for meat delivery at around 10:00 on Friday and meat removal between 5 and 5:30 on Saturday morning . Hopefully we will also have access mid-Saturday afternoon to retrieve burgers and saus.
- (i) AF & JC may not be available Friday pm and early Saturday (and won't know until Friday pm). We will notify Roger & Rupert on Friday late afternoon whether we can get home or not.
- (j) **IF we get home Friday** on schedule then we can:
 - (i) setup the spit on the Village Green on Friday evening
 - (ii) start the fire on Saturday morning
 - (iii) collect the meat from TC on Saturday morning
 - (iv) Put it on the spit (probably on the Village Green)
 - (v) and start the cooking.
 - (vi) Roger to put barn key through our door on Friday – if we are back – to access kindling
- (k) **IF we are fogged in on Alderney and cannot get home** on Friday, substitute plans are needed. Transporting the meat and/or the spit requires a large estate car so this means Roger and helpers.
 - (i) Collect spit from Cedar Chase shed (beyond garages 1-8). Roger has the number for the padlock. Clare Somerville at #18 is the CC person with the best working knowledge of the spit and has agreed to be available Friday afternoon. Shed also has wire & pliers (wire to go round beef), spanners, nuts & bolts to construct spit and attach to the 3 bolts on the plinth on the Village Green (VG bolts tested and greased this past week).
 - (ii) Cedar Chase shed also has bag with meat thermometer, graph for plotting temperature, pen, kitchen roll, cleaner, gauntlets, muslin to cover unattended meat.
 - (iii) Get the meat on the spit, either in TC kitchen or on Village Green. You will probably need a sharp carving knife (to poke for the bone). It also requires wire at least around the lower leg part; possibly also around the bulk, depending on how balanced the meat is on the spit.
 - (iv) Suggest leaving second part of spit in shed until Saturday morning – someone needs to collect it.
 - (v) Erection of spit on Friday evening. Spit stored in Cedar Chase shed. Roger has details.
 - (vi) Transporting meat to fire on Saturday morning before 06:00 – Rupert + Roger (for car), plus someone else to help lift ??? The beef on spit will be around 80Kg.
 - (vii) Fire starting around 05:00 on Saturday – Mike & Jacqueline. Kindling & newspaper will be put in the Barn by Jacqueline between 12 and 2 this Saturday. JC & AF and team will start fire if back.
 - (viii)
- e) Eva suggested that Rupert (event captain) will welcome everyone to the event rather than Eva – general agreement.
- f) Start cooking no later than 6am.
- g) Sharpening knives – Have a steel available on the night? Who will provide? Knives currently in barn – Jacqueline to retrieve from barn this Saturday between 12 and 2 and take to Roger for sharpening.
- h) Cat has fixed the rota.
- i) Council sorted for recycling

- j) Contact of Charlie can do First Aid for £150. We do have a medical kit (check Barn on Saturday). Should have a note in the Perkins Room and at ticket sales, with First Aider phone number.
- k) Charlie sorting buns – going to Costco on Tuesday? May be able to get pre-cut. Charlie & Rupert will sort. Charlie also to supply vegetarian option.
- l) Raffle -Alexander Devine Hospital. All good.
- m) Posters put up several weeks back still surviving fairly well in spite of the rain. Rupert has put up second batch of posters around the village Photo taken of list of sites (see end of these minutes).
- n) Ticket sales now active – 55 member, 62 non-member tickets already sold. JC sent reminder to all members, 12/6/26.
- o) Vegetarians – 2 mushrooms this year with sliced cheese. Charlie in control.
- p) Will Nigel provide hosepipe??? (Rupert to check). Disclaimers say parents responsible for children. Could we have a couple of extra buckets for burnt hands? In addition to bucket / watering can to control fire ???
